Holly Miller-Sullivan, 67, of West Hartford, beloved wife of Gregory L. Sullivan for 37 years, passed away peacefully on Wednesday January 4, 2017 after a short, but valiant fight against pancreatic cancer.

An inspiring career woman who touched many lives, Holly leaves us as a wife, mother, grandmother, sister, aunt, mentor and friend. She made an impact on so many people, both personally and professionally, and will be missed by all who were fortunate to know her.

In addition to her husband, Holly is survived by her two daughters and their families; Megan M. Sullivan Dacey and husband Craig A. Dacey and their daughter Nora S. Dacey of Los Angeles, CA and Emma M. Sullivan Ells and her husband James F. Ells of Brooklyn, NY. Holly's granddaughter, Nora, will forever remember her 'Nana'. Holly was born on December 27, 1949 in Farmington, CT, the daughter of the late William H. Miller and Arlene G. Miller.
