He was an automobile enthusiast, having been fascinated with cars since he was a young kid in Hartford, though in his lifetime he only purchased one brand new car. The others were nicely used cars he took great care to preserve, just as he did any item he ever bought. He was quite a fixer and enjoyed preserving items he loved.

Kenneth once joked that he could fit his friends into a phone booth, but this was untrue. His lifetime buddy Lloyd Schaffhauser was like a brother to him. David Farrah and the Farrah family were fond of Kenneth, Shawn Hoar knew and admired Kenneth as did many others. He made new friends with whom he had coffee almost daily. There were many

others who brightened his life, and they knew and know who they are. These friends were true gifts that Kenneth greatly appreciated.

He was a loyal and true friend and a somewhat rare individual who never would waiver from his principles for any amount of material gain. He was a communicant of St. Thomas the Apostle Church. He believed in his religion and had great faith, a truly fine man. He will be deeply missed by all who knew and loved him, and he will always be remembered in the depths of their hearts.
