He encouraged his daughters to strive for their personal best at all times and was most proud of their graduations from the University of Connecticut. He served in the National Guard for six years, studied at St. Joseph's University in Indiana and CCSU, then pursued a career as a high school History teacher for 12 years. His intrinsic motivation was one of his most amazing qualities.
