Four days short of his 24th birthday, on July 11, 2020, Marcus D. La Guardia passed away unexpectedly in Eugene, Oregon. Marcus grew up and attended schools in West Hartford and Mansfield, CT; graduated from E. O. Smith High School; and was a member of St. Thomas the Apostle Church, West Hartford.

Marcus is survived by his parents, Nancy P. La Guardia of West Hartford, and Dr. Ralph La Guardia and his stepmother Lynne La Guardia of Hebron. Marcus earned a Sustainable Food Service Certificate from Capital Community College. He continued his culinary career as a cook, and was a certified snowboard instructor, which led him to Oregon where he recently settled. He also worked on a Liberal Arts Degree, taking classes at Manchester Community College and Quinebaug Valley Community College.
