April 14, 1923 - December 13, 2006

Albert A. Lenge, 83, of West Hartford and Niantic, beloved husband for over 58 years of Rena Tonino Lenge, died Wednesday, December 13, 2006. He was born in West Hartford, on April 14, 1923, son of the late Frank and Concetta Bordieri Lenge. Al graduated from Hall High School in 1942 and served in the U.S. Navy during World War II. Immediately after the war he rejoined the family business now know as Lane & Lenge Florist. Al was an entrepreneur and in 1965 he purchased Maico Hearing Services allowing him to pursue the electronic skills he acquired in the U.S. Navy. He retired from The Albert A. Lenge Hearing Aid Services in 1993. Al's life was a life of service to family, friends and community.
