HASYCHAK, Alexis L. 55, of Wethersfield, CT unexpectedly departed this life on February 7, 2010. Alex was born in Hartford, CT on Nov.13, 1954, graduated Hall High School and the University of CT with a B A in 1982. He served in the U.S. Military Police and CT National Guard. He was a U.S. Border Patrol Agent 1983-1988 and a Staff Instructor at the Federal Law Enforcement Training Center in Glynco, Ga. Alex was a Special Agent, Criminal Investigator with the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service. In 2005 he went to Iraq as an International Police Instructor. Alex was a Naturalist/Herpetologist for the CT Audubon Society, a docent with the Rocky Hill Historical Society, a member of the CT Herpetological League, Sons of Union Veterans of the Civil War and the Combat Infantrymen's Association. He leaves his Mother, Dorothy B. Hasychak, one brother John Hasychak Jr and his wife Patricia, one nephew John Hasychak, III , one niece, Lara P. Hasychak, and a wealth of friends in Connecticut and Texas. Alex was predeceased by his father, John Hasychak.
