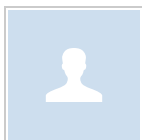
Don't worry Ana Lou, I will watch over Ray for you and help him through these difficult times; until you are both together again.

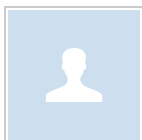
