Anna Anne M. Stack, 95, beloved aunt, sister-in-law and friend to many, went home to God on January 1, 2008. Born in Hartford on July 30, 1912, she was the daughter of Thomas J. Stack Sr. and Hannah Downing Stack. She became a naturalized citizen of the United States with her parents and her brother Tom in 1918. She graduated from Weaver High School Class of 1930. She worked at the Travelers for a short time before working at the City of Hartford's Bureau of Vital Statistics. She retired in 1972 after 40 years of service as an Assistant Registrar so she could care for her parents, garden and continue her volunteer work at the Cathedral of St. Joseph. She was easily recognized for her sweet smile, her giving disposition, and her collection of hats. She loved to travel and to go to New York City to the theater. She was predeceased by her parents and her brothers Thomas J. Stack, Jr. and Dr. William J. Stack. She is survived by her sister-in-law, Grace J.
