Anthony Lawrence Larry La Mont, 99, of West Hartford, CT, died peacefully on April 14 at St. Mary Home in West Hartford. Born in Bayonne, New Jersey, son of Salvatore and Lucia La Montagna, he grew up in New Haven, moved to Hartford and then Newington, where he raised his family and was responsible for much of its growth and prosperity in the 50's and 60's as a developer of custom residential homes, business properties and its then main shopping center. A partner in P. B. Isham Real Estate and then sole owner of Larry La Mont Realty, Inc., he was a commercial real estate broker for many years, an excellent and highly respected golfer, and a longtime member of the Wethersfield Country Club. Upon retirement, he moved to The McAuley Home in West Hartford where he lived for fourteen years, made many friends among staff and residents, and was the unofficial gardener for the B building.

He is survived by his three daughters, Sharon Charde of Lakeville, CT and her husband John, Susan McLellan of West Hartford and her husband James, and Deborah La Mont of West Hartford and her husband Stephen Brickman, two grandchildren, Matthew Charde of Concord, MA and his wife Hedi, Jaime McLellan of Fairfax, VA, three great grandchildren, Nicholas, Aidan and Max Charde, his former wife, Irene La Mont, and three nieces. He was predeceased by his parents, his sister Rose, and his grandson Geoffrey Charde.
