



Beverly Guthrie Talcott

October 17, 1922 - July 11, 2005

Beverly Jean Guthrie Talcott, 82, of Hartford, widow of Dudley Vaill Talcott, died on Monday, July 11, 2005 at her home at Avery Heights. Born in Burlington, VT, on October 17, 1922, she was the only child of the late Lloyd Guthrie and Helen Agnes Larned Guthrie. Her family drove across country, stopping briefly in Arizona before settling in Hartford, CT. She graduated from Bulkeley High School in 1940, where she was a member of the National Honor Society, and worked at the Travelers Insurance Company and Juvenile Court before marrying Dudley Talcott, sculptor, of Farmington in 1951. She was later employed by the Sisters of the Good Shepherd and the University of Connecticut Health Center. She leaves her first cousin Edna Burt of Wallingford, CT with whom she grew up, her daughters; Emily Morse Talcott and son-in-law Ken Lynch of Cambridge, MA, Lucinda Talcott Armillei and son-in-law Wayne Robert Armillei and their daughter Maria Katherine Armillei of West Hartford, CT and Jane Allen Talcott of Brooklyn, NY. She was predeceased by her son Randolph Hooker Talcott. In addition to her family, she leaves many dear friends including those she made at Avery Heights when she moved there 5 years ago. Those who knew her, will miss her appreciation of nature and art, her generosity of spirit, and her pleasure in others reflected in her youthful smile. Burial will be Saturday, July 16 at 9:00 am in Cedar Hill Cemetery, 453 Fairfield Ave, Hartford.
