Cesare Frank Figliuzzi, Sr, 86, of West Hartford, CT passed away on October 28, 2015. Cesare was predeceased by his wife of 56 years, Anna (Vicari) Figliuzzi, who passed away on September 25, 2015. He was the son of the late Nazzareno and Luigina (Valenti) Figliuzzi. Cesare was born on April 16, 1929 in New Rochelle, NY. He proudly served in the United States Army from 1951-1953.
