Charles P. Burke of Naples, Florida passed away peacefully at his home on March 21, 2012 after a long illness. Mr. Burke was cared for lovingly by close friends and family members in his last days, including his wife and daughter. Mr. Burke was born on August 19, 1938 in Elizabeth, New Jersey. After graduating from Thomas Jefferson High School, he joined the U.S. Air Force and was stationed at Stewart Air Force Base in Newburgh, N.Y. as an air traffic controller. He was discharged after four years of honorable service and began a long career with Xerox Corporation, holding several successively higher positions in sales and marketing. Mr. Burke lived in Holmdel, NJ for more than ten years. After 27 years with Xerox, he held positions with IBM Corporation, ADP and others before relocating to Naples, Florida and purchasing a printing business with his wife, Nancy. They operated KDN Printing for twelve years before retiring in 2007. Since then, he enjoyed golfing, piano, woodworking, traveling, spending time with family and relaxing in his adopted home of Florida. Mr. Burke is remembered for his integrity, dignity, quiet nature, and the deep love he had for his family and friends. He is survived by his wife of 25 years, Nancy Heller Burke; a brother, Edmund Burke of Piscataway, NJ; daughter Teresa Burke Wright and son-in-law Bradley Wright of Oak Hill Virginia; and daughter Ellen Burke Deaver and son-in-law George Deaver of Manalapan, NJ; as well as three adored granddaughters, Cassidy and Carlyn Deaver and Paige Wright. He was preceded in death by his mother, Katherine Klimek, and his brother John

Burke. He was greatly beloved and will be immeasurably missed.
