Don Miller of West Hartford, Connecticut died at 7:15 PM on Tuesday Jan. 4, 2005 of congestive heart failure at the Lawrence and Memorial Hospital. He is survived by his two sons, Stephen Miller and Michael Miller. He was born July 20, 1938 in Detroit, MI and was 66 at his death. Don graduated from the University of Ohio in 1962, obtaining his Bachelor's degree in only three years. Don attended the Navy OCS program and served aboard the U.S.S. Rangal as a communications/intelligence officer. After leaving the Navy, Don spent several years teaching high-school English in upstate New York. After the birth of his first son, Don and his wife Lauray moved to Hartford, Connecticut where Don worked for Aetna.

After the birth of his second son Don and the family moved to San Antonio, Texas where they lived for two and a half years and still retain many friends. Don and his family returned to Connecticut and moved into his house in West Hartford where he lived until his death. Don was the co-founder of C3 Inc. a Bloomfield based custom software company and was instrumental in the development of the company's main product Schedule People & Time.

Don was known for his intuitive grasp of computer software development. He was constantly involved in various on-line tech support boards where his advice was sought on a daily basis. His main hobby was Bluegrass music which he enjoyed listening to and playing on his banjo. Don was a member of
