It is with heavy hearts and profound gratitude for a life well-lived that we announce the passing of Donald Haupt of Farmington, a beloved father, grandfather, brother, uncle, and friend, who departed this world peacefully on May 19, 2026, at the age of 85. Born on May 11, 1941 in Detroit, Michigan, Don was the cherished son of Herbert and Edna Haupt.

As a boy, Don loved to work with his hands, regularly constructing and painting model cars. After graduation from Cass High School in Detroit, Don went on to study at Lawrence Tech, after which he secured his first job as a sales representative for Arrow Hart and Hegeman Electrical Company. In 1971, Don's job moved the newly-wed couple to New Jersey, where he continued working for Arrow Hart until the company wanted to transfer him to its headquarters in Hartford. Not wanting to leave New Jersey, Don left Arrow Hart and began working as a buyer for Bunzl Paper Products. He was a dedicated and respected co-worker there until his retirement in 2004.

As a youngster Don developed a lifelong passion for baseball, cheering fervently for the Detroit Tigers. This love for the game followed him throughout his life, and upon moving to New Jersey, he also became an enthusiastic supporter of the New York Yankees. In recent years, Don embraced his new home in Connecticut and became an avid fan of UCONN basketball.

In 1971, Don married the love of his life, Beverly Martha, with whom he shared a beautiful partnership for 53 years before her passing. Together, they raised two cherished children, Amy and Jerry, in New Jersey. Don's dedication to his family was unwavering, and he took immense pride in his role as a father and grandfather. His favorite moments were spent with his family, playing games, watching baseball, and attending countless music lessons, recitals, concerts, and sports events featuring his beloved grandchildren.

Don was deeply committed to his faith and community. As an active member of Christ Memorial Lutheran Church in East Brunswick, NJ for over 30 years he generously dedicated his time and talents as financial secretary and head of the ushers.
