Donald P. Ahearn, 75 of West Hartford and Old Saybrook, died Thursday, January 6, 2004, at home. Donald was born in Hartford, the son of the late Patrick F. and Margaret O'Brien Ahearn. Donald served in the US Army during the Korean War. He graduated Cum Laude from Boston College in 1951, and received his Juris Doctorate from Georgetown University in 1954. He entered the Bar Association in 1954 and practiced law both as a sole practitioner and in association with Bernard Francis, and Gary Gottesman until his retirement in 2003. He was a member of the Hartford County Bar Association, of counsel to LaSalette Missionaries, and sat for many years on the Board of Trustees for Mercy Housing and Shelter Corporation, in Hartford. Donald founded the Ahearn Family Foundation in 1995 to assist programs that serve the poor, support the arts and enhance education in Hartford. As well as a scholarship to Watkinson School in partnership with St. Patrick and St. Anthony's Church. He was a member of the Founders Circle at Northwest Catholic High School, and in 1996 began a scholarship at Boston College for the benefit of students from Hartford County. His kindness and generosity through the years has helped many individuals. He will be missed by those whose lives he touched. Don is survived by his son Terrence Ahearn of Old Saybrook, his step-son Doug Lea and his wife Debra, as well as their children Stephen and Courtney of Lafayette, LA, his long time friend Judy Uzell of Agawam, MA, and his long time and devoted employee Kathy D'Amato. The

funeral will be Monday at 10 a.m. in St. Patrick St. Anthony Church, 285 Church St., Hartford. Calling hours will be Sunday from 5-7 p.m. at the Molloy Funeral Home, 906 Farmington Ave., West Hartford.
