



Dr. Ned H. Cassem, S.J.

January 24, 1935 - July 4, 2015

Dr. Ned H. Cassem, SJ, MD of West Hartford, CT passed away peacefully on the night of July 4th in the comfort of his home with his family and caregivers by his side. Ned was born in Omaha, NE on the 24th of January, 1935 along with his twin brother John. Ned and John grew up in Omaha and attended Creighton Prep together before furthering their Jesuit educations separately. Ned attended Saint Louis University and went on to Harvard Medical School where he specialized in Psychiatry, graduating cum laude in 1966. He completed his theological degree and became an ordained Jesuit priest in 1970. A caring physician with a brilliant career in Consultation-Liaison-Psychiatry, and an expert in palliative care, he served as one of the greats in his field. Ned was Chief of the Department of Psychiatry at Massachusetts General Hospital from 1989 to 2000, and became Professor Emeritus of Psychiatry at Harvard Medical School. His passions went well beyond his global prominence as an empathetic end-of-life care authority. He was an avid outdoorsman - a 3-time Boston Marathoner, a skilled diver and underwater photographer, and an avian enthusiast. Ned was arguably among the most ardent supporters of our military, his fervor grounded in his own service to humanity as a civilian doctor in Vietnam during the summer of 1970, caring for children and families amidst the war. Ned is pre-deceased by his father Edwin, mother Winifred and twin John. Ned is survived by his sister in law, Audrey, and his nieces and nephews: Erin, Tom (Karen), Bridget and Gregory (Erin) and great-nephews Thomas, Riley and Craig. There will be a funeral mass for
