Elizabeth Struke Evans of Farmington, CT, passed away on May 13th after a long illness. She was born on February 3, 1928, the sixth child of Frederick William and Mary Martin Struke of Rochester N.Y. She was a graduate of both Nazareth Academy and Nazareth College in Rochester and later earned a Master's Degree from The State University of New York at Stony Brook. For many years she taught in parochial schools in upstate New York as Sr. Mary Corinne, a Sister of St. Joseph. She was a long time resident of Stony Brook, NY and retired from teaching in the Middle Country School District before moving to Connecticut to be closer to family.
