

Federick J. O'Brien

September 2, 1928 - April 15, 2008

Dr. Frederick J. O'Brien of West Hartford and Narragansett, R.I., passed away peacefully with his family by his side on April 15, 2008 at St. Francis Hospital. Born in Providence, R.I., to Helen Carey and John O'Brien, Fred was a graduate of La Salle Academy, Brown University and Boston University School of Medicine. After a year of internship at St. Francis Hospital, he spent two years in the U.S. Air Force, followed by two years of Medical Residency at Boston V.A. Hospital. Fred returned to St. Francis Hospital for his third year of residency and started his private practice of Internal Medicine in 1960, retiring in 2005. A true gentleman, Fred was devoted to his family, his faith, his medical practice and patients, his colleagues, and his many dear friends. He will forever be remembered for his integrity, kindness and gentle dignity. Fred is survived by his wife, Virginia Ginny Murphy O'Brien and their seven children, their spouses, and 14 grandchildren: son Michael, his wife Ann and their children, Michael and Kelly, all of Cheshire; daughter Joan, her husband David Wildfeuer and their daughter Rachel, all of Berwyn, PA; son Timothy, his wife Linda and their children, Sarah and Kevin, all of Wellesley, MA; son Daniel, his wife Andrea and their daughters Megan, Claire and Erin, all of West Hartford; daughter Erin, her husband Brian Earley and their children Christina, Meredith, Sean and Brigid, all of Franklin, MA; daughter Nora of Santa Monica, CA; and daughter Carey, her husband Chris McGlynn, and sons Conor and Brendan, of Oakville, Ontario. I still remember that blue SS Camaro thinking, "what a cool guy".

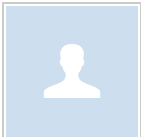
