Frances Chamberlin, 91, of West Hartford and Madison, died Friday July 15, 2005 at Middlesex Hospital, Middletown. She was the widow of Dr. Theodore Leroy Chamberlin, Lt.jg, United States Public Health Service United States Coast Guard who was killed in the North Atlantic in World War II. Frances Chamberlin was born in Hartford, the daughter of Frank and Abigail Foley. She was a graduate of Oxford School and Skidmore College and received a masters degree in education from the University of Hartford. She was a teacher in the Hartford Public School System, having taught at the Brackett School and subsequently, for many years at the Noah Webster School. She also taught at the Bugbee School, West Hartford while working for the Hartford Public School System as part of the volunteer interdistrict program. She is survived by her son, Brooks Chamberlin of Darien and Madison; her grandchildren: Brooke Nilsen of Stamford, Theodore Chamberlin of Shelton, Victoria and Brooks Chamberlin of Darien and two great grandchildren: Lily and John Nilsen of Stamford. She leaves a nephew, Richard Banbury of Marlborough and four grand nephews and nieces. She was predeceased by a sister, Geraldine Banbury of West Hartford, and a son, Theodore Leroy Chamberlin of Darien.
