August 9, 1925 - November 25, 2016

Dr. George R. Dalton, 91, of West Hartford passed away peacefully surrounded by his loving family on Friday, November 25, 2016. Born in Hartford, August 9, 1925, the son of Peter Dalton and Bessie (Breen) Dalton, he was a first generation Irish American. He leaves behind his wife of 60 years, Elaine (Kilty) Dalton. Dr. Dalton graduated from St. Augustine's School where he was Valedictorian and later attended St. Thomas Seminary. He served in the Navy during WW II on Destroyer Escort DE-703 as quartermaster/navigator. He attended Catholic University and Georgetown University Medical School. He did his fellowship in Immunology and Pediatrics at Walter Reid Hospital in Washington, DC. While working at St. Francis he met and fell in love with his beautiful wife, Elaine Kilty Dalton, who was a nurse. George was a well respected and caring pediatrician and allergist for 50 years in a private practice in the south end of Hartford. George was a lifelong avid reader, enjoyed golfing, and listening to music. Many great memories were made camping and skiing with his family. He had a great sense of humor we all enjoyed. He and his wife, Elaine, spent time traveling to Peru, Egypt, Ireland, China, and many other wonderful places with close friends. He is survived by his eight children, George M. Dalton, Kathleen Dalton, Kevin Dalton (wife Blair) and Michael Dalton (wife Kim) of West Hartford.
