Glen Ryan "G. R." Daugherty, passed away on April 18, 2011, surrounded by his family after a valiant 19 month struggle against cancer. He was born May 15, 1975, in Manchester, CT, the son of Glen A. and Elizabeth M. Britton Daugherty. He attended Whiting Lane and King Phillip schools and graduated from Hall High School in 1993. He also attended CCSU for two years. In addition to his parents, he is survived by his brothers, Patrick Daugherty and his significant other Shannon Forster: and Bryan Daugherty all of Portland, Oregon; his "sister" Janette Maxey and her husband Zeke McDaniel of East Hartford and Singapore and of course his sidekick, Pee Wee. He is also survived by most of his aunts and uncles; by 24 of his 25, first cousins, their wives and husbands; by all but two of their children and grandchildren; and by many, many friends. Glen worked for Barnes and Noble for 12 years first at the New Britain Ave. store and later at the Canton store where he was promoted to assistant manager. In the fall of 2009 he took "a grand tour" of the country and ended up in Flagstaff, Arizona, where Patrick then lived. He was soon hired as the assistant manager of the B& N, Flagstaff store. Just a month later at a check up for what he thought was prolonged "altitude sickness" he was diagnosed with Lymphoma. Calling hours will be Wednesday from 5-8 p.m. at the Molloy Funeral Home, 906 Farmington Ave., West Hartford. A celebration of his life will be held next week at a private memorial service. Per Glen's wishes there will be a private family funeral at

which time his ashes will be mixed with the soil at a sight of his choosing. 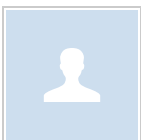
