Henry P. Neubert Jr., "Hank," passed away on May 29, 2021, at the age of 90. Hank was born on July 22, 1930 in Milwaukee, Wisconsin the son of Henry and Frances (Gross) Neubert. He was a graduate of St. Mary's High School in Burlington, Wisconsin (class of 1949) and St. Norbert College in De Pere, Wisconsin (class of 1956). Hank served in the US Army in Korea as a Sergeant First Class in the 936 Field Artillery Battalion during the Korean War. He was employed by the Hartford Insurance Company from 1960 to 1992, when he retired from the marketing department. He was especially fond of the Green Bay Packers football team, and playing golf at the Rockledge Golf Course in West Hartford. He is survived by his sons, Michael (Pamela) and Daniel (Eileen); granddaughters Sarah, Hayden and Abigail; his sisters, (all residing in Wisconsin) Joan Sniadach, Judith Bauman, and Dorothy Regner; his twin sister Virginia Karstedt; as well as many cousins, nieces, nephews and friends. He is predeceased by his wife of 58 years Teresa and his sisters Mary Davies and Shirley Hunsbusher.
