



## Jack Carlock Laflin

June 3, 1922 - February 3, 2012

Jack Carlock Laflin, born June 3, 1922 in Brooklyn, NY and passed away on February 3, 2012 at the age of 89. Jack was a skilled bridge player and played twice a week at the senior center with friend Lars Guldager. Jack cherished his Wednesday night poker game which he would host. His poker buddies included, Jeff Anopolsky, Marty Gould, Gene Wittenberg, Sam Tellar, Elliot Solomon, Steve Lucca and Jeff Solomon. Jack could always be found with a book or a crossword puzzle in hand, his love of reading would lead him to later author books, and create crosswords. He worked for many years as the sports editor for the former Channel 18, outside of work he could be found enthusiastically cheering on the Yankee's and Giants. Jack and Jo traveled extensively on many cruises to Alaska, Russia, tours of Europe and the Orient, keeping a journal of each stop, and allowing them to relive the trips and fill their house with many memories.
