James A. "Jimmer" Walsh, 81, the husband of Jane Halloran Walsh, died Sunday Dec. 3, 2006 at Hartford Hospital. Born in New Britain, the son of the late James A. and Mary Avery Walsh he had lived in Hartford for most of his life, moving to West Hartford 15 years ago. Mr. Walsh was a graduate of New Britain High School and St. Michael's College, Winooski Park, VT with a work career at Stanley Works, Kaman Aircraft, and Combustion Engineering. He was a decorated combat veteran of World War II, enlisting at age 17 and serving with the 69th Division in the European Theater of Operations. He was pre-deceased by his wife of 49 years Barbara Rose Walsh, with whom he raised his seven children in Hartford's West End.
