James F. Hearn, 88, of West Hartford, CT and Vero Beach FL, died Wednesday August 8, 2007 at Hartford Hospital. All his family were able to be with him during his brief illness. He was the husband of the late and beloved Margaret Bartholomew Hearn, and was predeceased by his son, James Bartholomew "Bart" Hearn, his siblings Jack Hearn, Mary Liddy and Kathleen Hearn.
