James F. Quigley, 66, beloved husband of Barbara Zaremba Quigley of West Hartford for 42 years, died Thursday, March 26, 2009. Born in Hartford, the son of the late James and Catherine O'Flaherty Quigley, he was raised in Hartford and made his home in East Hartford for 25 years prior to moving to West Hartford. He attended Bulckley High School and he attended the University of New Haven. Jim served in the US Air Force during the Vietnam War where he received the Air Medal for bravery and was a police officer for the City of Hartford for 27 years. He was a member of the P.B.A and was an effective and successful president of the Hartford police union for twelve years. After retirement he worked as a Judicial Marshall. Besides his wife, he is survived by his two children Kathleen Demsey and her husband Scott of Cheshire, James F. Quigley, Jr and his wife Dianne of New Hartford; two sisters, Maureen Foss and her husband Philip of Southington, Jean Shea and her husband Jack of Newington; his three beloved grandchildren, Fiona Quigley, Luke Demsey, and Colin Quigley. The funeral will be Monday at 9:15 a.m. from the Molloy Funeral Home, 906 Farmington Ave., West Hartford, with a Mass of Christian Burial at 10:00 a.m. in the Church of St. Timothy, West Hartford.
