James J. O'Loughlin, Jr., 90, devoted husband of 60 years to Alma Parsons O'Loughlin, and son of the late James and Catherine Kilmartin O'Loughlin, died Saturday September 1, 2007. Jim was a gentle, unassuming and quietly dignified man—a thinking, caring man about his family, friends and those less fortunate than himself. He was a man of deep faith, compassion, eloquence and wit. Jim appreciated the richness of the English language and enjoyed reading, writing, solving crossword puzzles and entering contests. He was a life-long Yankees fan, and was a summer resident of Black Point Beach Club, East Lyme since 1926. Born in Hartford, he attended LaSalette Seminary in Hartford, and had resided in Bloomfield since 1956. Before retiring in 1982, he was employed by Arrow-Hart Electric Co. for 42 years. Jim was a former president of the Arrow-Hart Men's Club, a former president of the Connecticut Writers' League, and served as a Eucharist Minister for Sacred Heart Church in Bloomfield. Besides his wife, he is survived by two daughters and sons-in-law, Laurene and Tony Evans of East Granby; Kerry and John McCarthy of Westbrook; and two beloved granddaughters, Katherine Evans and her husband Matthew Chmielewski of Bloomfield, and Bethany Evans of West Hartford. He was predeceased by his son James III, his sister Mary O'Loughlin and his brother Rev. John O'Loughlin, MS. Funeral services will be held at Sacred Heart Parish of Bloomfield, 26 Wintonbury Ave. Bloomfield with calling hours on Wednesday, Sept. 5th from 4-7 p.m. in the church and the

celebration of a Mass of Christian Burial on Thursday, Sept 6th at 10:00 a.m. in the church. Burial will follow in Mt. St. Benedict Cemetery.
