James Joseph Conran, 74, husband of Sheila Robinson Conran of West Hartford, died Friday, July 27, 2007 at his home. He graduated from Kingswood Oxford and served in the Airborne Medical Battalion of the US Army during the Korean War. He was a founding member of the Tabor House, was a member of the Knights of Columbus #3600, a member of the American Legion Post 0096, a former member of the West Hartford Rotary, was a communicant of St. Thomas the Apostle Church, serving on the parish council, and was home school president.
