John Everett Cartland III, 62, of West Hartford, died Saturday, April 7, 2007 at Hartford Hospital. Born in Paterson, NJ, Jack was the son of the late Dr. John E. Cartland, Jr. and Klazina Kuiken Cartland. He was a graduate of The Loomis School, Bowdoin College, Georgetown University School of Law, and the Harvard Business School. Jack practiced law at Robinson & Cole before a successful business career in corporate finance at the Aetna and the Travelers Insurance Companies. Jack was a trustee of the Grace Bliss Foundation and volunteered his many talents with the Connecticut Radio Information System and Big Brothers and Big Sisters. He was a member of the Connecticut Bar Association, the WALKS Foundation, The 1892 Club, the Hartford Golf Club, the Prouts Neck Country Club in Scarborough, ME, and Asylum Hill Congregational Church. In addition to Lucy Campbell Cartland, his wife of 37 years, Jack leaves his daughters Kathryn C. Anderson of Windham, ME and Elizabeth F. Cartland of Brookline, MA; his son-in-law Kenneth R. Anderson and his grandson Holden Everett Anderson of Windham, ME. He also leaves behind his brother Richard E. Cartland and his wife Elaine of West Hartford and their children Christopher and Timothy; his sister Carolyn R. Cartland of Bloomfield; Eleanor Flynn Cartland of Glastonbury, and her family; his brothers-in-law E. Mac Campbell of Farmington, Duncan Campbell of Divonne, France, and Gregory Campbell of Scottsdale, AZ and their families. He was pre-deceased by his brother Charles E. Cartland. Jack loved many people and had that affection returned in abundance. Funeral services will be
