John F. Conway, 90, of West Hartford, died Sunday January 1, 2006. Born in Hartford, he was the son of John J. and Bridget Clifford Conway. He was a graduate of Weaver High School. He attended the University of Pennsylvania Wharton school of Finance where he received his degree in economics in 1938. While at Penn, John was President of his fraternity, Delta Sigma Phi, and played varsity sports on both the baseball and golf teams. During WW II John served his country in both Italy and North Africa and was honorably discharged with the rank of 2nd Lieutenant. His employment career included government service working in real estate and financing. He attained the position of Assistant Chief Underwriter with the FHA Federal Housing Administration. John was also a certified FHA and VA appraiser. In addition to his wife Barbara Brickley Conway, he is survived by his son and daughter-in-law; Arthur and Mary Brickley of West Hartford, three grandsons; John, Kevin and Michael Brickley, his sister Marguerite Conway and many beloved nieces and nephews.
