SWADE, Judith "Judy" Gladstone Judith "Judy" Gladstone Swade, 60, a longstanding resident of Windsor, died in the Hospice Unit at St. Francis Hospital on Monday June 27, 2005 after a long struggle with complications of systemic lupus. Judy's husband Leonard and her siblings were by her side. Born in Burlington, VT, she was the daughter of the late Dr. Arthur Gladstone and the late Esther Dinner Gladstone. Judy was a graduate of the University of Vermont and also received her Masters Degree from there in Education. Judy taught in the Bloomfield primary school system at Laurel School for 23 years and at Metacomet for two years. During her final days, Judy spoke to everyone at her bedside saying, "My students were my children." Judy and Leonard have been ardent volunteers for a myriad of social causes; in addition, Judy was past President of the Connecticut Lupus Association where she was also a Board member for three decades. She was a past co-President of the Sisterhood at Beth Hillel Synagogue in Bloomfield. She is survived by her loving husband of 27 years, Leonard Swade; her sisters, Miriam Saiger and her husband George of Potomac, MD and Kerana Kraft and her husband Avram of Highland Park, IL; her brother, David Gladstone and Sarah Rehm of Burlington, VT; by her niece, Rachel Kraft of Chicago; her nephews, Aaron Saiger and his wife Lisa Gordis of New York City, Adam Kraft of Chicago and Ira Saiger and his wife Sara of New York City, and Jennifer Rehm of Burlington, VT; as well as family and friends throughout the country.
