A Hall High School graduate, he served as a military police officer in the 9th Infantry Division stationed in Germany during the Korean War. Larry returned to Connecticut and obtained his bachelor's degree from the University of Connecticut in agriculture. He then began his career at Michigan State University as a 4-H Youth Agent for 28 years serving Osceola and Berrien Counties in Michigan. While in this role, he completed his master's degree in education. Larry received many honors during his career including the National Distinguished Service Award given by the 4-H National Association and the Distinguished Faculty Award from Michigan State. Following his retirement in 1988, he and Oris relocated to Calusa Lakes in Nokomis, Florida. There they were members Venice Presbyterian Church. In retirement, he enjoyed the company of friends and many rounds of golf, including multiple holes-in-one. In recent years, he returned to West Hartford where he enjoyed his time with family and friends. Larry enjoyed his many four-legged companions over the years. Larry is survived by his daughter, Lynn Wronker and her husband Steve; his son, Laurence Cushman III and his wife, Cyndy; his grandchildren; Wesley Cushman (Jennifer), Geoffrey Crandall (Sara), Megan, Hannah, Paige, Kaitlyn, and Jordyn Cushman.
