Lucette Marie Faulkner, 94, passed away September 25, 2024 in West Hartford. 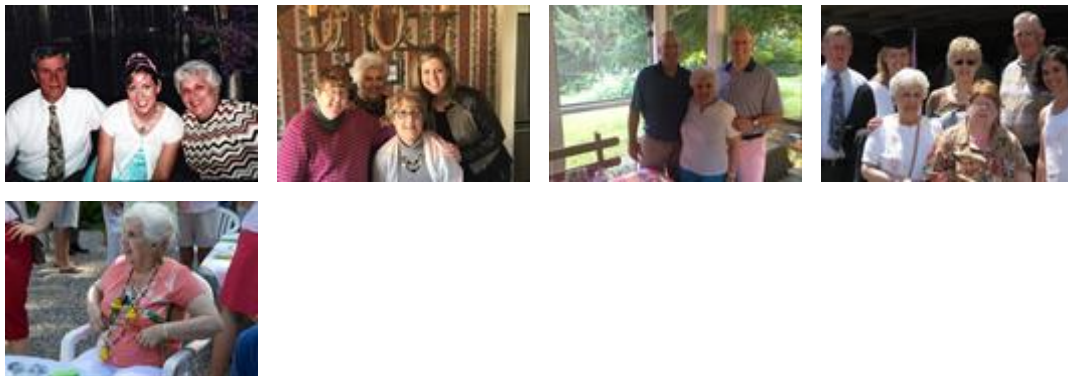
