Margarette Patricia Lowes Santy, 82, of Farmington, formerly of New Canaan, died Tuesday, July 14 at home. She was married for 52 years to William Godfrey Santy who predeceased her on July 14, 2002. She was born on February 11, 1927 in La Tour de Peilz, Vaud, Switzerland, the daughter of Thomas Preston Olivier Lowes and Dorothy Margarette Elliott Lowes. She immigrated to the United States and graduated from Stamford High School and then from The Merrill Schools, which provided her with lifelong secretarial skills. After a brief return to Switzerland, she moved permanently to her adopted United States becoming a citizen in 1951, where she married Bill, raising their two children in New Canaan. Before retiring, Mrs. Santy was a legal secretary for many years at a law firm in New Canaan. However, her main focus was her family ? providing a warm home where many family occasions and friendly gatherings allowed her to demonstrate her kind and caring nature, as well as her well-appreciated culinary skills, which she passed on to her children. 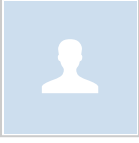
