Marie T. Gill of 275 Steele Rd., West Hartford, widow of Judge Thomas D. Gill, died August 29, 2007 at the age of 94. She was born December 7, 1912 in Southington, the daughter of the late Alphonse and Helene Gustafson Thomas, with whom she spent her formative years in the Borough of Plantsville. Prior to her marriage she was a model with the Powers Agency in New York City and later an employee in the Trust Department of the Connecticut Bank and Trust Co. To the degree that her lifelong dedication to the well being of her family permitted, she participated in meeting the needs of her community. For many years she was a volunteer in assisting the handicapped at the Greater Hartford Easter Seal Rehabilitation Center. She participated in the founding of the Women's Auxiliary of the Salvation Army of which she was a lifelong member. She also served for many years as a member of The Friends of The Mark Twain House.
