Marshall I. Golden, son of Maurice and Bess Golden and loving husband of the late Loretta Golden, died September 27 at his home in West Palm Beach. Born in Hartford he attended Bulkley High School and Trinity College. Marshall was a Captain in the Army Air Corps stationed at I E Shima during the Japanese surrender. He moved to Newington in 1950 and was the owner of WT Jackson Car Dealership. He became Sales Director at Roskin Distributors and eventually named President of Lancer Yachts. He was Connecticut's first Boating Safety Commissioner under Governor John Dempsey and was Past District Governor of District 23-B of the Lions Club. He was a member of the Sphinx Shriners and Sequin Masonic Lodge. He was also a lifetime member of Indian Hill Country Club. He will be missed by his children: Sandra and Dr. Paul Gandel, Deborah and Lawrence Doughty, Kimberly and James Juliano and Myles and Gail Golden, as well as 11 grandchildren and 11 great-grandchildren. He also leaves his brother, Dr. Kenneth and Jeannine Golden, his companion, Francine Dellaripa, and his best friends, Harold and Jack. He was predeceased by his son-in-law, Denis Sedory, and his sisters, Vivian Berns and Faith Knight.
