Mary-Beth Moriarty, 53, of West Hartford, died on Thursday July 27, 2006. She was born at St. Francis Hospital in Hartford, on August 24, 1952 to Marion Cashion Moriarty and Francis S. Moriarty of Manchester. Mary-Beth was a 1970 graduate of East Catholic High School, a 1974 graduate with special honors of the College of New Rochelle, and a 1979 graduate of the St. Francis Hospital School of Nursing with BSN and MSN degrees and a CCRN certification. She provided 25 years of dedicated service in nursing at St. Francis Hospital Medical Center in Hartford. Mary-Beth was also a clinical and contributing editor at R.N. Magazine, where she was twice recognized with the Jesse H. Neal Award for Editorial Excellence. In addition to her parents, Mary-Beth is survived by her sister Kathleen Wirtalla and husband Denis of Manchester, her sister Nancy Roberts and husband Clinton of West Hartford, her sister Sheila Waters and husband John of Windsor, her brother Kevin Moriarty of Jeffersonville Vermont, her brother Brian Moriarty and wife Tamara of Northampton, MA, and her brother Stephen Moriarty and wife Tina of Coventry, and by her eight nieces and nephews.
