Mervyn Rimai MD., beloved husband of Dale Hume-Rimai, of West Hartford, passes away peacefully on Sunday, March 13, 2016, in the Hospice Care at St. Francis Hospital. Dr Rimai was born in the Manhattan, NY on October 14, 1939. He was a graduate of Bronx High School of Science and received his BS from City College of New York in 1960. He went on to attend medical school at the University Liber de Bruxelles in Belgium where he graduated in 1966 with honors. He was also a Major in the US Army during the Vietnam War working as a medical doctor. He then went into private practice the summer of 1973 and was affiliated with both Saint Francis Hospital and Mount Sinai as an internist as well as various convalescent homes in the greater Hartford area. Dr. Rimai and his wife opened the Family Adult Daycare for the Elderly in 2011. He served as their medical director until his retirement in 2013. He was known by his colleagues, patients, nurses and residence as a caring and compassionate physician. He was an avid fly fisherman. His favorite fish to catch was salmon. Besides his wife of 12 years, Dr Rimai is survived by four step children, Alloy Hume, Denise Hume, Kyle Bryan and Kia Bryan; five grandchildren, Sade Hume, Natalia Hume, Mason Hume Swiecki, Emerson Hume Swiecki, Payton Emery Miller; a brother; and his mother-in-law Phyllis Gaitor.
