Surrounded by family and friends, Mildred (Millie) Ellen Griggs Reynolds, 85, passed peacefully into eternal rest on August 25, 2014. Millie attended the Juillard School of Music in New York City, where she studied piano and performed with a variety of musical groups for several years. Millie married her high school sweetheart, Bill Reynolds, on June 12, 1948, and moved to Bridgeport, CT. After returning briefly to New York City, they moved to Plainville, CT, where they started their family. While her children were young, Millie worked for Connecticut Bank and Trust and The English Shop in West Hartford Center, attended the University of Hartford, and acquired her real estate license. Eventually, the family moved to West Hartford, and while providing administrative and accounting support to her husband's new CPA business, she started her own highly successful investment company, M&M Associates. She was a gifted musician, talented athlete, loved animals and was an extremely devoted, supportive and loving daughter, wife, mother and grandmother. Millie always put the needs of others before her own; spending countless hours supporting her children's and grandchildren's many pursuits. She particularly enjoyed long walks with her dogs; and playing soccer, basketball, board games, and building puzzles with her grandchildren.

Millie was a long term member of St. Helena's Church and believed strongly in giving to those less fortunate than herself. She was a generous donor to multiple charities and personally rescued numerous animals over the course of her lifetime. Millie may best be remembered for her bright blue eyes, sharing her love of music, promoting education, her strong work ethic, her selfless devotion to her extended family, her love of animals, especially horses and dogs, and her generous spirit.
