Nancy P. Kennedy, 74, of West Hartford, wife, mother, and teacher, died Tuesday February 14, 2006 at St. Francis Hospital and Medical Center. She is the wife of John T. Kennedy. Born in Willimantic, the daughter of the late Carl and Eleanor Donovan Peters, she had made her home in West Hartford the past 37 years. Nancy was a graduate of Willimantic State College and earned her Masters Degree from Central Connecticut State University. Before her retirement, she was a reading specialist with the Wethersfield Board of Education, working at Highcrest School in Wethersfield.

Besides her husband, she is survived by her six children, their spouses and her 11 grandchildren; John T. Kennedy, III of Wellington, NV, and his children Brian, Jane and Sam; Mary K.
