Peter Duncan Craig, September 1, 1963 – November 16, 2025, was raised in and remained a resident of West Hartford, Connecticut. He leaves behind his parents, Harold and Sandra Ann Craig; his four brothers and their wives—Michael (Joy), Colin, Paul (Jessica), and Scott (Joy); and his nieces, Kathleen and Olivia.

In his younger years, Peter earned his Engineering Degree from the University of Hartford and completed postgraduate work at the University of Connecticut. He went on to work as an IT Engineer and was known throughout his whole life for his effortless intelligence, which never failed to show in everything from engineering innovation, to the smallest details of everyday life.

Those who knew Peter describe him as truly at home outdoors. He was an adventurous outdoorsman who took extensive hiking trips to numerous national parks and trails alongside good friends. He was quick to explore beyond established paths—someone

who could take on extreme trips like a hike to the bottom of the Grand Canyon and mention it with casual confidence. This seems a true reflection of Peter himself—self-assured, determined, and always capable of taking the path less traveled. Peter not only cherished these memories of the great outdoors, but nature also inspired his talent to turn any scene into the tremendous works of art he leaves behind. As an avid painter, Peter might have considered his later work to be “a work in progress,” but their beauty prevails. Those unfinished paintings now seem a reflection of Peter himself—leaving this work, and all of us, too soon.

We remember Peter as a beloved family member, a loyal friend, a lover of art and music, and of course a lifelong Patriots fan. He leaves behind a legacy of remarkable intelligence, quick witted humor, and a quiet strength that will stay with all who knew him.

I hadn't seen him since, but think of him often. I thought there'd be time to catch up again, like we always have. But I am grateful for all the wonderful memories that will never be lost.
