



## Peter Paul Knusto

November 4, 1916 - March 13, 2007

Peter Paul Knusto of West Hartford, husband of Nell Brazauskas Knusto, died suddenly at St. Francis Hospital on Tuesday, March 13, 2007. He was born on November 4, 1916 in Sag Harbor, L.I., N.Y. to the late Barbara Malinowski and Anthony Knusto. He graduated from Hartford Public High School in 1935 and earned an Accounting Degree from Hillyer College. Peter lived in Windsor from 1954 to 1985 when he moved to West Hartford. He was a communicant of Holy Trinity Church in Hartford where he served as a Trustee and Vice-President of the Parish Council. He was a former Treasurer of the Lithuanian American Citizens Club, a former Squire of West Hartford, and a member of St. Casimir's Club in Poquonock. He served on the Windsor Democratic Town Committee for 13 years and on the Windsor Board of Tax Review. He was employed by L.F. Dettenborn for 27 years as an accountant and estimator and retired from the Westfield Woodworking Co. after 16 years as an estimator. He served in the U.S. Army from 1941 to 1945 in the Persian Gulf. Peter shared his creative talents in charitable ways as in building the chapel in St. Getrudes's Church in Windsor, in building and donating the altar, tables, railings for Holy Trinity Church in Hartford, and in helping the Sisters of St. Joseph and the Sisters of St. Francis in various capacities over the years. He also volunteered for the Red Cross. Peter was an avid and champion bowler in local leagues. He is predeceased by his parents and his sister, Justina Sperry. Besides his wife, Nell, he is survived by a niece, Barbara Curry of Florida, and a nephew, Bradford Sperry of Massachusetts. Funeral services

will be held Friday March 16th at 9:30 am from the Molloy Funeral Home 906 Farmington Ave. West Hartford, with a Mass of Christian Burial at 10:00 in Holy Trinity Church, 53 Capitol Ave. Hartford.
