April 30, 1918 - January 19, 2017

Raimonda Mauriello Tobin of West Hartford passed away Thursday, January 19, 2017 at the age of 98. Born April 30, 1918 in Hartford, to Anthony and Madeline Mauriello. She leaves behind her son Rev. Joseph Tobin and his wife Susan of West Hartford, Granddaughter Martha Tobin of Phoenix, Arizona, Grandson Jonathan Tobin and his wife Christina of Chester and great-granddaughter Addison Tobin. She also leaves her niece Denise Nelson of East Hartland and close friend James Roback of Newington. She was predeceased by husband of 43 years Joseph M. Tobin Sr. and all of her younger siblings Annetta Merlino, Dr. George Mauriello, and Gloria Nelson.

Raimonda retired from Veeder Root as Executive Assistant to the Chairman of the Board after a lengthy career serving in a variety of roles. Never one to sit idle, she was the Founder and President of the Alzheimer's Association of Greater Hartford, Founding member of the West Hartford Historic Association, and lifelong dealer of antiques. Her commitment to improve the care, understanding, and environment of those suffering with Alzheimer was a result of her husband's battle with the disease. Her dedication led to multiple improvements in patient care standards as well as support structures for both victims and caregivers.
