Born the fifth of seven children to William and Genevieve Daly Brewer on July 14, 1939, Ray learned early the value of family and friends, and fought hard to see to their needs throughout his life. Ray's children Stanley Russak, Valerie Russak Sutton and her husband Jeffrey, Raymond Brewer, Jr., Kelley Brewer Posey and her husband J.J. and Sean Brewer all share in the grief of their father's passing. An avid sports fan, Ray has joined his deceased son, Bradford Brewer, who passed away in 1995 at the age of 22. Together, now, you can probably hear them hooting and hollering for their favorite teams: Notre Dame and the New York Yankees. A proud grandfather, Ray leaves behind several cherished grandchildren: Kayla and Brianna Brewer, who made their home with him here in West Hartford; his granddaughter, Destiny Bristow who lives in California; and a number of grandchildren who reside in North Carolina: Jessica and Jeffrey Sutton; Raymond, Brad, Noah and Madison Posey. All of them have rich memories of the wonderful meals their grandpa would prepare for them and the games of cards and chess which might follow his gourmet meals. Earlier this year, Ray lost his brother Bill, who had helped to show him the way. Together they found great comfort and wonderful fellowship among the Friends of Bill. They both took great pride in this organization. His youngest brother John, who died at age 19 as a victim of

cerebral palsy, also awaits the big brother who worked to make his life more comfortable during his time on earth. The rest of Ray's siblings, his brothers Ned Brewer and his wife Carol, his brother Donald Brewer, and his two sisters, Sr. Pat Brewer and Mary Brewer, also have many rich memories of this very tough guy with a heart of gold.
