Richard Kennedy, 83, of Bloomfield, the husband of Constance Coffey Kennedy, died Saturday Feb. 23, 2008 at Hartford Hospital. Born in Norwich, the son of the late Maurice and Margaret O'Brien Kennedy, he had lived in Bloomfield for over 40 years. Mr. Kennedy was a graduate of the University of Hartford, a member of the Connecticut Academy of Fine Arts, and the Essex Art Association. He served in the US Army during World War II, fighting in campaigns in France, Belgium, and Germany, including the Normandy breakout, the Hurtgen Forest and defending the bridge at Remagen. Richard was a sales representative for Gustave Fischer in Hartford for many years and in retirement he taught Life Drawing classes at the University of Hartford and for the Farmington Art Guild. Besides his wife "Connie", he is survived by four children, Maj. R. Justin Kennedy, USA ret. of Alexandria, VA, Allison Douglas and her husband Bruce of Canton, Col. Paul J. Kennedy, USMC and his wife Kristine of Stafford, VA, Lt. Morgan P. Kennedy, Prince Georges County Police Dept. and his wife Sherri of Huntingtown, MD; eight grandchildren, Meghan, Molly, Prairie, Cheyenne, Mary, Benjamin, Erin, Riley; his great grandson Colt; his brothers; Maurice Kennedy and his wife Evelyn of Lady Lake, FL, Philip Kennedy and his wife Nancy of West Hartford, Jerome Kennedy and his wife Charlotte of West Hartford, his sisters, Margaret Samolyk and her husband Edward of Windsor, Eleanor DeMaio of Boston, MA, Lucille O'Connell and her husband Neil of Farmington, and numerous nieces and nephews.
