May 14, 1918 - January 25, 2005

Rita Giannettino Dowd, 86, of West Hartford, beloved wife, mother, sister and friend died peacefully at home with her loving family by her side. She was born on May 14, 1918 in Hartford, daughter of the late Louis and Rose Kelly Giannettino. She graduated in 1937 from Bulkeley High School. In 1947 she married William Dowd, sharing 53 years together until his death. She was a founding member of the Church of St. Timothy in West Hartford. She helped lead the efforts to build Eisenhower Park in West Hartford. After raising seven children, Rita at age 62 went to work full-time as an employee of the University of Hartford, retiring at the age of 80. She will be remembered by her family and friends for her loving spirit and wonderful sense of humor. She is survived by her family including son, John and his wife, Connie of West Hartford, son David and his wife Nancy Fournier of West Hartford, daughter Denise MacKenzie of Rocky Hill, daughter Rosemary and her husband Gary Martin of Granby, son Mark and his wife Richarda Hellner of Avon, daughter Elizabeth and her husband Thomas O'Shea of Windsor, and son W. Allen and his wife Judith of Wethersfield. She also leaves a sister Catherine E. Godbout of Newington; 16 grandchildren; and several nieces and nephews. Rita was predeceased by a brother, Louis Giannettino, and three sisters, Mary Mooney, Rose Kablik and Ruth Scott.
