Robert J. Daly, 90, of West Hartford, husband of the late Norma (DeLise) Daly, died Saturday Nov. 3, 2012 at St. Francis Hospital. Born in Hartford, he was the son of the late Dr. Charles W. and Cecelia (Scanlon) Daly, MD, the youngest of five siblings. Bob was a graduate of Hartford Public High School (1940), and Providence College, Class of 1950. He was a US Army veteran of WW II. Upon retiring from the Banking Department, State of CT, where he served as a bank and credit union examiner, he volunteered for 14 years in the admissions department of Northwest Catholic High School. He was an ardent fan of the Red Sox, and the Providence College Friars. He is survived by his four children; Robert J. Daly, Jr., Charles W. Daly and his wife Mary, Margaret E. Daly, all of West Hartford, and Thomas G. Daly of Glastonbury. His brother the Rev. Monsignor Charles W. Daly of Bloomfield, his eight grandchildren, 3 great grandchildren, and several nieces and nephews also survive him. He was predeceased by his infant daughter Elizabeth Ann, his sister Mary D. Redden, and his brothers, John F. Daly and the Rev. Joseph M. Daly.
