Robert C. Hager, 88, beloved husband of the late Marjorie (Porter) Hager, of Hartford and recently West Hartford, died Saturday, June 30, 2012. Born in North Adams, MA, the son of the late Charles and Mary (Barry) Hager, he made his home in Hartford for 67 years. Robert served in the Army Air Corps during World War II and was a member of the 446 Bomb Group. Following the war he worked for Pratt & Whitney as a master tool maker and remained a union man at heart even after he was promoted to supervisor. He retired after 42 years of service. Always the perfectionist, he took great pride in restoring his 1874 home in Hartford. Bob was always active with his family. He helped his wife and daughters girl's scout's activities often volunteering to deliver the cookie orders or help at the Cerebral Palsy Association where his wife worked for many years. He shared many interests with his wife from antiquing in Brimfield, to traveling to England to visit family and sights he remembered from the war and spoiling his favorite cat, Dillon. He is survived by his daughter Elizabeth Pachkovsky and her husband Richard of West Hartford, his son-in-law, Donald Ranger of Hartford; four grandchildren, Christina Lamphere, Michael Ranger and his wife Darby, Alexander Pachkovsky, Katherine Pachkovsky; his great grandson, Andrew Lamphere; his sister Margaret DeGara; and many generations of nieces and nephews. He was predeceased by his daughter Jane Ranger, and two sisters Dorothy Hurlburt and Jeanette Murphy.
