Salvatore J. Pricone, 89, of West Hartford, beloved husband of Rose Trocchi Pricone, died Friday Nov. 14, 2008 peacefully at home with his family. The son of Paul and Carmela Perruccio Pricone, Sal was born December 29, 1918 in Hartford and grew up in Wethersfield. Sal moved to West Hartford in 1948 when he married Rose and remained a resident until his death. Sal served in the United States Army for 4 1/2 years during World War II. In 1942 he deployed to Panama, where he was stationed for three years in defence of the Canal Zone. After his honorable discharge in October 1945, Sal was treasurer of the Marie Phillips dress manufacturing company, a family business in Hartford with an office on Broadway in New York City. Later he continued working for several dress manufacturing companies until his retirement in August 1986. Sal was devoted to his wife, children and grandchildren. In addition to his wife of sixty years, he is survived by his daughter, Cynthia Pricone Jacobs and her husband Gregory Jacobs of West Hartford; a son, Richard Pricone Price and his wife, Cynthia Price of Berlin; and four grandchildren who he loved dearly, Brian and Diana Jacobs and Jakob and Jilian Price. His sister, Rose Lombardi of Wethersfield also survives him as well as many nieces and nephews. Funeral services will be Tuesday Nov. 18th beginning with calling hours from 9-10 a.m. at the Molloy Funeral Home 906 Farmington Ave. West Hartford, followed by the celebration of a Mass of Christian Burial at 11 a.m. in St. Thomas the Apostle Church, West Hartford.
