Sanford Lindy, 86, cherished husband of Lillian Lindy, passed away on Thursday, November 5, 2009 at the Hebrew Home & Hospital. Born in Center Brunswick, NY, son of Jack and Rose Lindy, Sandy graduated from Troy High School and then joined the US Navy. He was stationed in Pearl Harbor at the time of the Japanese attack and spent the rest of the war years in various islands in the South Pacific. Sandy was a passionate skier until the age of 80, an avid reader, and enjoyed gardening. He was an enthusiastic world traveler, and with his wicked sense of humor, made lifelong friends wherever he went. As his last act he donated his body to the UConn School of Medicine. Besides his wife Lillian, he is survived by his daughter Judy and her husband Dr. Alvin Ruthenberg of New York City, and daughter-in-law Marilyn Lindy of Niskayuna, NY. He dearly loved his grandchildren, Michael Trossman of Washington, D.C., Joshua Lindy and his wife Nicole, Jeffrey Lindy of New York City, and Kate Lindy of Boston, MA.
